

# Windows to the world

For Weather Shield, a switch to UPS meant no broken promises — or glass.

hen your business is windows, "fragile" is more than just a word on a cardboard box. Weather Shield has been manufacturing high-end custom doors and windows for 50 years. Founder Edward "Lee" Schield started the business in 1955 when he borrowed \$300 and rented a 12-by-24-foot garage in Medford, Wis. This is where he began handcrafting doors and storm windows to serve as "shields" against the weather.

Today, Weather Shield annually manufactures hundreds of thousands of windows and doors for both residential and commercial projects. As one of the nation's largest window and door manufacturers, the company boasts more than 2 million square feet of manufacturing space, with plants in five cities.

"We're a well integrated company," says Robert Gibbons, director of purchasing. "We have our own raw lumber, and we turn it into a finished product."

And getting that product to the customer isn't always easy. "Obviously, in windows, glass is involved," Gibbons

says. "It's a somewhat fragile commodity." As such, every broken pane is income down the drain.

So when a rising number of Weather Shield's replacement windows were falling prey to shipper negligence, the company switched to UPS, enlisting the company's package testing lab to develop a safe and affordable way to ship glass.

"We're utilizing their labs and test methods to come up with a package that will prevent damage in transit," Gibbons says.

Against this backdrop, Gibbons says UPS has implemented services that have enhanced Weather Shield's ability to track

shipments online. Prior to using online tracking, the company was plagued by games of phone tag to locate shipments.

"We've gone to a master agreement where all our facilities ship UPS as our preferred provider," Gibbons says. "That allows us to use the online tracking system, which saves us from making multiple phone calls. Now we can get back to the customer within minutes."

Weather Shield has also integrated UPS WorldShip\* software at each of its major shipping locations. This Windows-based application helps standardize shipping procedures, rates and tracking across all five of the company's plants.

"It's incredibly efficient," Gibbons says. "We believe the reliability and tracking have increased our business now that customers can depend on our service."

And the customer, according to Weather Shield vice president Mark Schield, is what it's all about. "Many companies start small and grow into large businesses," Schield says. "Somewhere along the way some of those companies lose touch with their customers." At Weather Shield, the focus is always on the customer.
